Since natural gas plays such an important role in our everyday lives, maintaining our system reliability is a high priority. At Texas Gas Service, we work hard to keep our customers safe and provide reliable service. Part of that means keeping our pipelines and facilities secure from outside harm.

Did you know that you can play a part in that effort, too?

If you ever observe something unusual or out of the ordinary near one of our facilities, call us at 800-959-5325 to report the incident. If you feel there is an immediate threat or emergency, you should always call 911.

Be sure to describe the location, when it occurred, what happened and how many people were involved, along with detailed descriptions of any people or vehicles.

Unusual activity near our pipeline facilities includes:

- People acting suspiciously or loitering;
- A suspicious or unmarked vehicle parked nearby;
- Any suspicious packages left nearby;
- People recording or monitoring activities;
- People showing unusual interest; and
- People taking photos or notes.

Don't Dig Until You Do This

Warm days and long evenings present the perfect time for outdoor digging projects. So, you just get the shovel and get to work, right? Wrong.

Before you pick up the shovel, pick up the phone and dial 811.



Buried pipelines, electrical cables and other utilities could exist just about anywhere you dig. Unexpectedly striking a pipe or cable not only runs the risk of damage and disruption of service, but also could put you and others in danger.

Texas Gas Service is committed to helping you keep your family and property safe.

When you call before you dig, the Texas One-Call System notifies Texas Gas Service and other operators of underground facilities to mark their buried assets within 48 hours (excluding weekends and holidays) of the request. The lines will be marked with flags or spray paint to let you know to stay clear of that area when digging. It's important to keep these markers in place until all digging is complete.

So, remember: For every digging project – no matter how large or small – call 811.

#CookingWithGas Recipe of the Month



Grilled Corn Salad

Ingredients

- Vegetable oil (for grill)
- 3 tbsp fresh lime juice
- 2 tbsp honey
- 1½ tsp hot sauce
- Kosher salt
- 4 ears of corn, in husks
- 2 small poblano chiles
- 3 tbsp unsalted butter, melted
- 2 scallions, chopped
- ¼ cup cilantro, chopped

Directions

1. Heat your natural gas grill to medium and oil the grate. Grill corn (still in husks) and chiles, turning occasionally, until corn is charred all over and chiles are blackened in spots and crisp but tender, about 10-12 minutes for corn and 8-10 minutes for chiles. Transfer to a platter and let cool slightly before shucking corn.

- Whisk lime juice, honey and hot sauce in a bowl; season with salt.
- 3. Cut kernels from cobs into a bowl and toss with melted butter, add lime juice mixture. Remove seeds from chiles and chop. Add to corn along with scallions and cilantro. Toss to combine; season with additional salt if needed.
